

Statement from Foulden, Mordington and Lamberton Community Council on the changes to the speed limits in Foulden as part of the Spaces for People Project.



Scottish Borders Council (SBC) are in the process of further altering the speed signage in Foulden as part of their ongoing review and modifications to their Spaces for People research project. This work will also include installation of an Active Speed Indicator beside the phone box in Foulden Village.

The Community Council has been liaising with a group of residents to discuss issues regarding these proposed changes to the speed limits through Foulden, and the Community Council Chair has been liaising with SBC.

Monitoring of speeds and compliance to this adjusted signage will continue over the summer.

There are still considerable concerns in some locations and there are further improvements that we feel can be made and will lobby for.

These alterations should be considered as work in progress and not final.

It is hoped all concerns and feedback will be taken into consideration by SBC as the summer goes on.

Residents are recommended and encouraged to convey their own feedback to SBC through the online survey, which is now open.
