

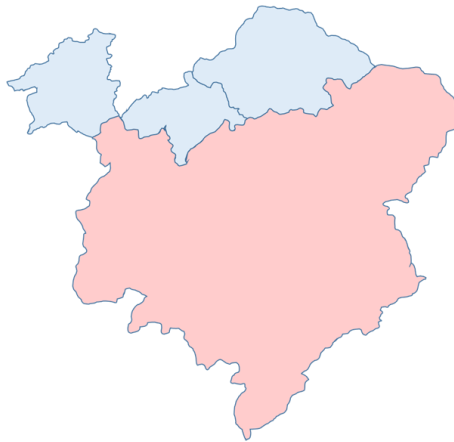

# Community Sergeant Update

It is the start of the school summer holidays which will be a well-earned break for teachers, pupils and their families. COVID-19 has impacted negatively on all areas of our communities and in particular children and young people. Mental and physical wellbeing has been effected and education and learning has been disrupted. Families on lower incomes have experienced particular hardship and placed under significant pressure. Although the situation with the pandemic seems to be improving children and young people will continue to struggle to deal with the after-effects and getting back to normal.

The Police Scotland website has Young Persons Advice pages specifically aimed at young people between five and nineteen years old. These pages give a wealth of advice on everything from personal safety, life at home, children's rights, drugs/alcohol and where to seek help. These pages can be accessed by clicking <https://www.scotland.police.uk/youth-hub/> and I would ask this be shared throughout communities.

SBC have also launched two new health and wellbeing services.

Kooth is an online counselling and emotional wellbeing support service providing young people aged 11-18 with a safe and secure means of accessing support from a professional team of qualified counsellors. This can be accessed at [www.kooth.com](http://www.kooth.com)

Togetherall provides a supportive, online community for all residents aged 16 and over living within the Scottish Borders. Trained professionals are available 24/7 and there is a choice of safe therapeutic services, including online self-help courses. The holiday period will also see an increase in children/young people gathering in public places and although those likely to engage in disruptive behaviour are in the minority please can the community remain vigilant to any anti-social behaviour. To allow us to impact more meaningfully matters should be reported to Police **at the time** so we can try to identify those responsible. This should be done via 101 or in an emergency via 999.

There will be an increase in people holidaying in the UK due to current travel restrictions and as such roads will undoubtedly be busier than normal. With this in mind it is important to:

- **Plan extra time for your journey**
- **Pay attention to speed limits and other road users**
- **Follow local COVID-19 restrictions**

With this increase in travel in mind I wish to highlight the annual Police Scotland Summer Drink Drive Campaign. This is about increasing motorist awareness of the risks associated with drink/drug driving. The campaign will involve a combination of intelligence-led high visibility patrols and static road checks by all operational police officers including Roads Policing Units. The aim is to enforce legislation through detection of offenders, reduce the occurrences of Road Traffic collisions

particularly those with alcohol and/or drugs as a causation factor and finally educate drivers and discourage them from drink/drug driving through high profile policing and media campaigns.

### **Protecting most vulnerable**

*In June 2021 Police in the Scottish Borders attended and were involved with around 139 mental health related calls, around 42 missing person enquiries and approximately 91 Domestic related incidents.*

*East Berwickshire had 9 mental health related calls and 7 missing person enquiries. Due to GDPR and protection of victims/subjects involved, we are unable to share any more specific information in relation to these type of call within this report.*

*Police Scotland work in collaboration with key partners to assist the most vulnerable within the communities and to provide support.*



### **Reducing Violence and Anti-Social Behaviour**

#### **Assaults**

On 03/06/2021, a report of assault at an address in Haymons Cove, Eyemouth. Following enquiries female traced and issued with Recorded Police Warning.

On the 13/06/2021 report of a disturbance at a local public house in Eyemouth, police attended where following enquiries a male and female were charged with various offences and reported to the Procurator Fiscal.

On the 14/06/2021 report of male being assaulted in Albert Road Eyemouth. Enquires continuing.

On the 18/06/2021 report of a female being assaulted in Coldingham Road Eyemouth. Enquires continuing.

On the 19/06/2021 report of assault at an address in Applin Cross, Coldingham Eyemouth. Enquiries continuing.

### Anti-Social Behaviour

On 01/06/21, police were called to Gunsgreen Circle, Eyemouth regarding a male causing a disturbance. Police attended, no disturbance.

On 03/06/21, police were called to Nisbet Avenue, Eyemouth regarding off road motor vehicles being used on a road. Area searched, no trace of the vehicles.

On 05/06/21, a call was made to police of a large group fighting outside the Newcastle Arms, Coldstream. No fight on police attendance.

On 07/06/21, police were called to Eyemouth Harbour regarding youth causing a disturbance. Police attended and no complaints were made.

On 07/06/21, a call was made to police regarding noise from a garden in Gunsgreen Park, Eyemouth. No noise on arrival.

On 11/06/21, police were called to a disturbance in Marine Square, Eyemouth. Police attended spoke to persons involved, no complaints.

On 12/06/21, a male was drunk and incapable in High Street, Eyemouth. He was issued with a recordable police warning.

On 13/06/21, a call was made to police regarding fighting in High Street, Coldstream. No persons fighting on police arrival.

On 18/06/21, a male was assaulted in High Street, Eyemouth, a male was arrested and charged.

On 27/06/21, police were called to Glebe Place, Chirnside, regarding a drunk male. No complaints.

### Vandalism

There were no vandalisms recorded in East Berwickshire in June.



## Reducing Acquisitive Crime

### Theft by Housebreaking

On the 03/06/2021 report of a window being forced and items stolen after entry gained, to a business premises on the Acredale Industrial Estate, Eyemouth. Enquires continuing.

On the 03/06/2021 report of a fire exit doors being forced and entry gained, to three business premises on the Acredale Industrial Estate, Eyemouth. Nothing reported as being stolen. Enquires continuing.

## OFFICIAL

On the 17/06/2021 report of an attempt to gain entry to a property at Crosshill, Chirnside by force attempt failed. No entry gained enquires continuing.

On the 26/06/2021 report of 2 motorbikes being stolen from a property at Acredale, Eyemouth. Enquires continuing.

### Theft

On the 02/06/2021, a number of car batteries have been stolen from Eyemouth Recycling Centre. Enquires ongoing.

On the 12/06/2021, report of theft at property in Masons Wynd, Eyemouth. Following enquiries male traced and issued with Recorded Police Warning.

On the 22/06/2021, report of theft at Acredale Industrial, Eyemouth. Enquiries continuing.



### Improving Road Safety

Within the Jedburgh Sheriff Court Jurisdiction there were 14 parking tickets issued in June.

On 03/05/2021 a driver was issued a fine and penalty points for not obeying white lines on the A1 north of Ayton.

On 04/06/21, a car was stopped in Eyemouth Harbour for not having an MOT. The driver was issued with a conditional offer.

On 07/06/21, a report was received by police of a female driving in Cockburnspath without a full licence. The driver was charged and the car seized.

On 25/06/21, a car was stopped for having no insurance or MOT. The driver was given a conditional offer and the car was seized.



### Tackling Serious and Organised Crime

On 3<sup>rd</sup> of June 2021 officers executed a search warrant at an address in Hawick, following a search of two properties £200 of Diamorphine and Approx £2000 worth of Cannabis Plants were recovered. A male and female were arrested and a report will be submitted to the Procurator Fiscal.

On 4<sup>th</sup> of June 2021 Scottish Borders Community Action Team executed a search warrant at an address in Peebles. After a search of the property Cocaine and Cannabis were recovered. A report will be submitted to the Procurator Fiscal.

On 8<sup>th</sup> of June 2021 whilst on patrol in Kelso officers stopped a female and conducted a search for drugs, the female was found in possession of pills that are suspected to be harmful Roche 10 pills. A report will be submitted to the Procurator Fiscal.

On 13<sup>th</sup> of June 2021 officers executed a Stolen Property search warrant at an address in Kelso, the male occupant was arrested on outstanding arrest warrants and numerous items from Theft

Housebreakings from the local area were recovered. The male has been reported to the Procurator Fiscal for multiple offences.

On 16<sup>th</sup> of June 2021 a search warrant was executed at an address in Hawick and following a search of the property Cocaine to the value of £6000 was recovered. The two occupants of the property were arrested and a report submitted to the Procurator Fiscal.

On 26<sup>th</sup> of June 2021 officers on patrol in Galashiels came across three males from Midlothian fishing on the river, all three males were found in possession of cannabis. A report has been submitted to the Procurator Fiscal regarding this.

### Rural

### Redeployable CCTV

- Camera has been deployed in Jedburgh in response to vandalism at the public toilets at Murrays Green
- A camera continues to be deployed in Eyemouth town centre at the request of the Community Action Team in response to youth-related ASB

### CAT Update:

**ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOUR** – During June the CAT have completed targeted mobile and foot patrols, paying attention to youth hotspot areas including Peebles, Kelso and Eyemouth. They have attended calls in relation to youth ASB, seizing alcohol, with letters being issued as appropriate.



**DRUGS** – CAT have searched 3 properties, and 30 individuals, during June, with Class A and B drugs being recovered with a potential value of £4192. Officers continue to carry out patrols to deter and detect the misuse of drugs.

**ROAD SAFETY** – Antisocial driving continues to be reported as an issue, and the CAT have carried out patrols of areas of concern. As a result, CAT have carried out numerous static road checks, issuing 21 fixed penalty notices to drivers for a variety of offences. Antisocial Driving warning notices have been given to 8 drivers in relation to their driving behaviour. Parking patrols have been completed with numerous penalty notices issued.

**RURAL CRIME** – CAT carried out rural crime patrols alongside Northumbria Police, in relation to the theft of farm equipment and machinery in both areas.
